Ram Krishna Singh (b-1950) has been continuously contributing to Indian English poetry since 1980s along with L.H. Rizvi, D. C. Chambial, D. H. Kabadi, Sayed Ameeruddin, Baldev 'Uniresearch's houseational Multidisciplinary E-Research Journal

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Mirza etc. He is a strong poet with considerable output, such as, My Silence (1985), Med Unmemorical (1988), Flight of Phoenix (1990), Music Must Sound (1990), I Do Not Quel (1994), My Silver and Other Selected Poems: 1974-1994 (1996). Above the Earth's Gre (1997) and Every Stone Drop Pebble (1999). These verse volumes earn him a perpetual place among the celebrated poets. He gives up the decorum (rhyme a brhythm) and also the punctuation mark in some of his poems.

The idea of poetry has certainly changed in his writing. Conventional poetry is left at bay. The poet liberates language from the shackles of traditions and customs and adds special effects to it. His earlier poems deal with the theme of love and sex, erotic, explorations, deep distrust of religious taboos and inhibitions, the urge for openness and wildness, an escape from societal covenants and conventions, a distrust of religious rituals, revolt against contemporary bureaucracy, and political humbuggery.

His Flight of Phoenix (1987-1989) contains untitled poems, the postmodern vignettes of verse. In Memorie. Unmemoried (1986-1987) the poems have the same effect. Concreteness and specificity are added here. Music Must Sound (1971-1985) is related with sex and sensuality. The absence of values worsens the situation. R.K.Singh tries to figure out the cause of this deplorable postmodern socio-political condition. He holds the leaders responsible for the bleak condition of the nation in the present time. He calls them 'blunderers' who are 'trapped by gains' sapping the energies of the country that could build up the nation. He writes.
